

Summer projects




This summer we were able to work on several greatly needed projects at the dome property. This was made possible through gifts from a few visiting groups.

Keren Sweet Featured Missionary



Keren has been serving with IDT since February 2014. She is a Jewish believer who came to the Lord at age 14. Over the years her gifts have been used in many diverse ways; first in the local church with a servants heart; Keren has managed pantries, kitchens and nurseries, organized and ran prayer ministries as well as organized large outreach events. In 2009 the Lord began to call her to her Jewish roots. Through a local messianic congregation, she became involved in Jewish evangelism; visiting college campuses, parks and



malls to share the Good News of Yeshua with the local Jewish population as well as teaching classes to others who also had a heart to reach the lost House of Israel. Messianic worship became a passion, she became a member of a local Davidic dance team, serving as part of the Shabbat worship team and also going out into the local Christian community to teach dance and share about the Jewish roots of their faith. In 2013 the Lord sent Keren to serve in Israel for several months, working with an Israeli-Arab Christian ministry serving the poor, widowed and orphaned. She traveled throughout northern Israel as well as the Palestinian controlled territories. Upon returning to the states in February 2014 she felt the call to join those serving in Baja with IDT and begin a teaching ministry here ~ M'Piv, which means "out of His mouth" in Hebrew, based on Proverbs 2:6 "The Lord gives wisdom, out of His mouth come knowledge and understanding." M'Piv seeks to teach and instill a sense of intimacy with our Creator; strengthening believer's walks in Messiah by giving them new insights into discernment and the ability to understand and apply the wisdom found in the Word of God on a daily basis. M'Piv also includes messianic worship through dance; teaching dance to scripture sung in Hebrew is very powerful and then, taking those very same dances and applying them to local music, allows for the heart's worship to flow forth! God has been gracious, since starting her ministry He has blessed her with many open doors, allowing her to partner and coordinate with several ministries and congregations in the San Quintín Valley.



Children's Home Update

We currently have 9 girls in our children's home run by Johanne Manzano. The girls range in age from 4 to 19 years old and are in kindergarten, elementary, middle school, high school and college! Johanne's two youngest daughters (both age 15 and in high school), and one of her adult daughters and her 2-year-old daughter, Johanne's granddaughter, also live in the home. It's a full, happy and safe haven for all!

Mexico has recently passed new laws regarding the licensing of orphanages and those who care for children. These laws require us to follow elaborate bureaucratic processes and to pay for expensive professional services and administration fees. We would like to ask for prayer for all of these new challenges. Areas in which we need help include the purchase and installment of more emergency lights, rope ladders, smoke detectors, other safety equipment and the finances to cover the cost to install proper drainage systems on the property, to have it leveled and surveyed, along with funds to satisfy other costly government requirements.
